ACPractice reading and writing sight words: the, of, and, to, in, is, you, that, it, he, was, for, on, are, as, we, his, they, be, no, have, from, or, has, by, me, what, little, she, this, when, your, said, there, use, go, which, one, do, how, my, like, out

Writing: Use sight words and sound out words to write and label pictures. Write a sentence to tell about a picture.
