### Weekly Story: Tops and Bottoms

## Math Objectives

#### DESCRIBE AND COMPARE MEASURABLE ATTRIBUTES

Students will:

- use attributes to describe different objects
- use words to describe how an object can be measured
- solve math problems about objects with measurable attributes by using precision
- describe the time of day (morning, afternoon, evening)

**Vocabulary:** attribute, morning, afternoon, evening, height, length, longer, shorter, taller, capacity, balance scale, heavier, lighter, weight, temperature, warmer, cooler
